

Pilgrimage Travel





Arrival in Athens

- Upon arrival at Athens International Airport, you will be met by our representative and transferred to Athens city center.
- Experience the timeless spirit of Athens on this expertly guided highlights tour, designed to showcase both the city's ancient treasures and its rich religious heritage.
- We begin with a photo stop at the Panathenaic Stadium, the world's only marble stadium and site of the first modern Olympic Games. A panoramic drive then introduces us to key landmarks such as the Zappeion Hall, the Temple of Olympian Zeus, the Athens Trilogy, the Parliament and Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, Hadrian's Arch, Constitution Square, and other architectural gems.
- Our religious focus includes visits to:
 - ❖ Athens Metropolis (Greek Orthodox Cathedral) Seat of the Archbishop of Athens, blending 19th-century architecture with a strong place in Orthodox life.
 - Catholic Cathedral Basilica of St. Dionysius the Areopagite Neo-Renaissance (1865) Catholic basilica honoring the first Christian bishop of Athens, a disciple of St. Paul.
 - ★ Kapnikarea Church 11th-century Byzantine church on Ermou Street, one of Athens' oldest and most photographed landmarks, blending Christian and earlier pagan influences.




Arrival in Athens

- We then ascend to the Acropolis, exploring its masterpieces: the Propylaea, Temple of Athena Nike, Erechtheion with the Caryatids, and the iconic Parthenon, symbol of classical beauty and harmony.
- A visit to the Acropolis Museum follows, with its world-renowned collection of artifacts and the spectacular Parthenon Hall.
- The tour concludes with a return transfer to the hotel, enriched by an inspiring journey through Athens' sacred sites, ancient monuments, and vibrant history.
- Overnight stay in Athens.







Island Pilgrimage Escape

• Breakfast at the hotel, then depart for a full-day excursion to a nearby island, combining the experience of Greece's vibrant island life with a visit to one of its most important pilgrimage sites.

Option 1 – Tinos: Panagia of Tinos

Early morning transfer to the port of Rafina or Piraeus for the ferry to Tinos, a Cycladic island renowned as the spiritual heart of Greece.


On arrival, ascend the grand, carpeted avenue leading to the Church of Panagia Evangelistria, built to house the miraculous icon of the Virgin Mary discovered in 1823. The icon, believed to be painted by St. Luke, is credited with countless healings and miracles, making Tinos a major pilgrimage destination comparable to Lourdes or Fatima.

Inside, admire the church's impressive architecture, icons, and relics, while learning about its role in both religious life and modern Greek history, as the discovery of the icon coincided with Greece's War of Independence.

Time permitting, enjoy a stroll through the picturesque town of Tinos, with its neoclassical mansions, traditional marble craft shops, and charming cafés.

Return by ferry in the evening to Athens.

Overnight stay in Athens.

• Breakfast at the hotel, then depart for a full-day excursion to a nearby island, combining the experience of Greece's vibrant island life with a visit to one of its most important pilgrimage sites.

Option 2 – Aegina: St. Nektarios Monastery

After breakfast, transfer to Piraeus for the short ferry crossing to Aegina, a beautiful island known both for its pistachios and its deep spiritual heritage.

Visit the Monastery of St. Nektarios, one of the most important modern pilgrimage sites in Greece, dedicated to St. Nektarios of Pentapolis (1846–1920), one of the most beloved Orthodox saints. Canonized in 1961, he is venerated as a healer and protector, drawing pilgrims from around the world.

The monastery complex includes the saint's tomb and relics, a small chapel where many faithful come to pray for healing, and the striking neo-Byzantine basilica, among the largest Orthodox churches in the Balkans.

Pilgrims and visitors alike often light candles or receive holy oil in memory of the saint, making the experience deeply moving even for those outside the Orthodox tradition.

After the visit, there will be time to explore Aegina's lively town, enjoy a walk along its neoclassical seafront, and sample local specialties — particularly the world-famous Aegina pistachios, sold in charming market stalls.

Afternoon ferry return to Athens.

Overnight stay in Athens.



Athens' Sacred Circuit & Corinth

- Breakfast at the hotel, followed by a full-day exploration of Athens' most significant monastic sites and a journey to Ancient Corinth to walk in the footsteps of St. Paul, blending sacred tradition with classical history.
 - Petraki Monastery Founded in the 10th century, now a tranquil cloister housing relics and a monastic library.
 - Agia Irini Chrysovalantou Monastery, Lykovrissi Known for its miracle-working icon and charitable work; pilgrims often receive blessed bread and apples.
 - ❖ Penteli Monastery (Mount Penteli) Historic monastery in a pine-covered setting, famed for relics and frescoes; also linked to philanthropic work.
 - Ancient Corinth & the Bema of St. Paul Archaeological site where St. Paul addressed the Corinthians; includes Temple of Apollo, Roman forum, and small museum.

- Overnight stay in Athens.



Pilgrimage Transfer Athens → Meteora → Thessaloniki

- Breakfast at the hotel, then depart early for Thessaloniki with a remarkable stop at the Meteora Monasteries, where faith meets breathtaking landscapes, before arriving in the city to explore its most important Byzantine landmarks.
 - ❖ Meteora Monasteries (Kalambaka/Kastraki) UNESCO World Heritage site with six active Orthodox monasteries built atop towering rock formations (11th−16th centuries). Visit 2–3 accessible monasteries, each with unique frescoes, relics, and panoramic views.
- Continue north to Thessaloniki, arriving late afternoon.
 - Church of St. Demetrios 5th-century basilica and crypt dedicated to the city's patron saint.
 - Hagia Sophia of Thessaloniki 7th-century church modeled after Hagia Sophia in Constantinople, with important mosaics.
 - Brief drive/walk to Byzantine Walls for panoramic city views
- Overnight stay in Thessaloniki.





Departure from Thessaloniki

- Breakfast at the hotel, check-out and morning at leisure for your last-minute shopping or strolling down the streets of Thessaloniki.
- Early transfer to Thessaloniki International Airport for your international flight.



Additional Sites if Stay Is Extended

City Highlights Tours

❖ Thessaloniki City Highlights Tour — Discover the city's vibrant history through sites like the Rotunda, Arch of Galerius, White Tower, Ladadika district, and the Archaeological Museum.

● En route Athens → Thessaloniki:

- ❖ Hosios Loukas Monastery (Boeotia) UNESCO-listed Byzantine monastery famous for its gold mosaics; possible if you choose a route via central Greece rather than Karpenissi.
- ❖ Mount Olympus / Dion Archaeological Park Adds a mythological and archaeological layer to the journey.
- ❖ Proussos Monastery (Karpenissi) A dramatic cliff-side. Clings to a cliff in the Agrafa mountains; houses the icon of Panagia Prousiotissa, said to have been painted by St. Luke. Features frescoes, chapels, and a small museum.

Near Thessaloniki:

- ❖ Panagia Soumela Monastery (Veria) 20th-century monastery founded by Pontic refugees; houses the venerated icon traditionally painted by St. Luke.
- Church of Hosios David (Latomos Monastery) Late 5th-century church with superb mosaics; UNESCO-listed.
- ❖ Church of Panagia Chalkeon 11th-century brick church in the heart of the old market area.
- ❖ Philippi UNESCO archaeological site where St. Paul founded one of the first Christian communities in Europe; includes basilica ruins, Roman forum, theater, and Lydia's baptismal site.
- ❖ Amphipolis Ancient city on St. Paul's route; see the Lion monument and city ruins.
- ❖ Mount Athos UNESCO World Heritage monastic republic with 20 monasteries, center of Eastern Orthodox monasticism for over a millennium. Accessible only by special permit (men only) via boat from Ouranoupoli.
